NOTICE 156 OF 2018****ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS ACT, 2005 (NO.36 OF 2005)****NOTICE IN TERMS OF REGULATION 9A OF RADIO FREQUENCY  
SPECTRUM LICENCE FEE AMENDMENT REGULATIONS**

The Independent Communications Authority of South Africa hereby issues a notice for the increase of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Licence Fees in line with the regulation 9A of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Licence Fee Amendment Regulations, 2015, as published in the Government Gazette No. 38642 of 2015.

Effective from 1 April 2018, all annual radio frequency spectrum licence fees will be increased by 5.3% based on the average Consumer Price Index (CPI).

Annexure "A" contains the radio frequency spectrum licence fees that will be effective from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018.

### **"ANNEXURE "A"**

- (a) The Unit Price per MHz paired is R 2, 226.00 (Two thousand and Two Hundred and Twenty-Six Rand) plus 5.3% CPI = R 2, 344.00 (Two thousand and Three Hundred and Fourty-Four Rand).
- (b) The Minimum Fee is R 134.00 (One Hundred and Thirty-Four Rand) plus 5.3% CPI = R 141.00 (One Hundred and Fourty-One Rand).
- (c) The Minimum Fee for a Satellite Hub Station is R 55, 647.00 (Fifty-Five Thousand Six Hundred and Forty-Seven Rand) plus 5.3% Consumer Price Index (CPI) = R 58, 596.00 (Fifty-Eight Thousand Five Hundred and Ninety-Six Rand).
- (d) The GEO areas are:
- High density – includes Gauteng Province and the municipal areas of Cape Town and Durban.
  - Low density – includes all parts of South Africa that do not fall under high density.
