	<p>The purpose of the submission was to request Council to approve the transfer of an I-ECS and I-ECNS licences from Stream Broadband (Pty) Ltd ('the applicant') to Thobela Telecoms (RF) (Pty) Ltd ('the transferee').</p> <p>On 18 July 2017, the Authority received applications from Stream Broadband (Pty) Ltd ('the applicant') to transfer its I-ECS and I-ECNS licences to Thobela Telecoms (RF) (Pty) Ltd ('the transferee').</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The applications were submitted using the Form G of the Process and Procedures Regulations for Individual licences published on 30 March 2016 in the Government Gazette no.39871 ("Processes and Procedures Regulations"). • The applications were published for comment on 27 October 2017. • No written representations were received by the closing date on 16 November 2017. <p>The licencing division was satisfied that the information submitted by the applicant confirms that the transferee meets the minimum requirement of 30% equity ownership held by historically disadvantaged Individuals (HDIs).</p>

	<p>Monitoring Report on measurements conducted during Q4 of 2017/18 in the Northern Cape Province for publication.</p> <p>The Annual Performance Plan of Engineering and Technology sets out a target to conduct QoS monitoring quarterly. A snapshot drive tests in the following provinces was conducted;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Limpopo, Mpumalanga, North West, Free State, Gauteng and Northern Cape. • The Authority conducted measurements in the Northern Cape Province between 22 January 2018 and 05 February 2018, covering a total distance of over 2500 kilometres, targeting areas around Kuruman, Upington, Springbok, Kamiesberg and Calvinia. <p>The aim of the monitoring was to assess the QoS provided by the mobile operators as perceived by the users.</p> <p>All mobile operators have committed themselves towards improving network quality in the affected areas through continuous network optimisation and future network infrastructure investments.</p>
